

NAIL GUNS – ISSUES & REMEDIES



FINISHING GUN NAIL JAM CLEARANCE





Step 1

Remove battery from tool to ensure it can not be activated during this process



Step 2

As an extra precaution
turn the trigger lock on



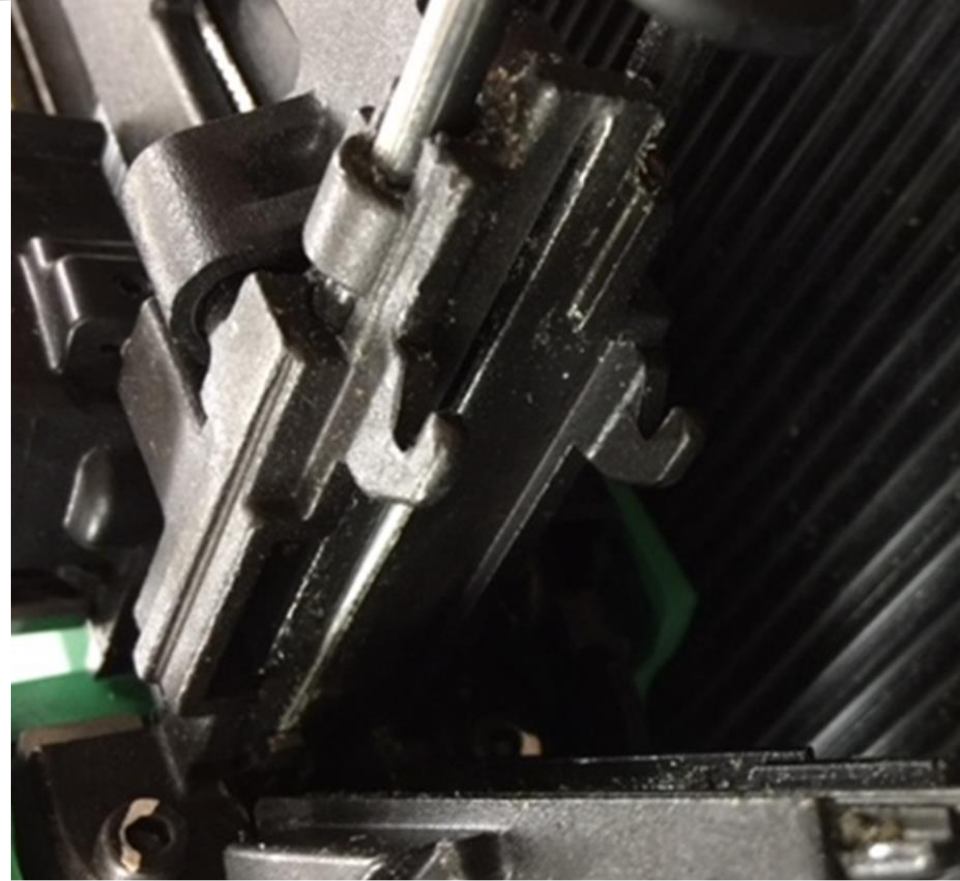
Step 3

- If possible remove nails from magazine
- Be sure not to force them out to avoid damaging the tool



Step 4

Lift the lock lever for access to the top of the nail magazine



Step 5

Open up access to top of magazine and clear nail jam



FRAMING GUN JAM CLEAR



Step 1

Remove battery from tool to ensure it can not be activated during this process



Step 2

As an extra precaution
turn the trigger lock on



Step 3

- If possible remove nails from magazine
- Be sure not to force them out to avoid damaging the tool

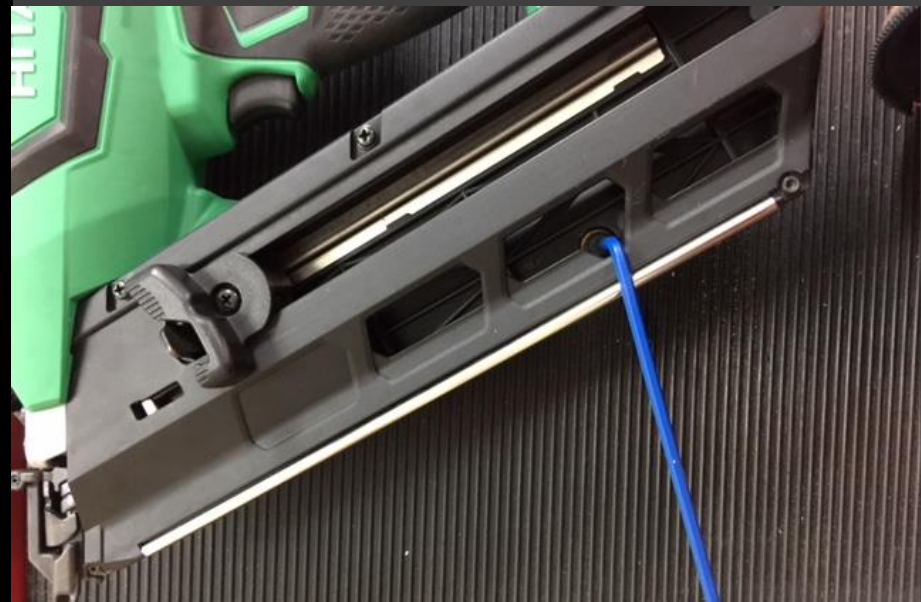
Step 4


- Find a 4mm allen key, this will be required for the jam clearing process on the NR1890DBCL



Step 5

- Undo the 3 socket cap screws shown in the pictures, this will allow for the magazine to be removed





Step 5 cont.

- Magazine removed

Step 6

- Make sure any dirt/grime is cleaned out of the nail guide on the gun
- DO NOT LUBRICATE THIS PART

Step 7

- Clear jammed nail/s
- Make sure any dirt/grime cleaned off too – use a rag or compressed air
- **DO NOT LUBRICATE THIS PART**



Magazine cleaning



Step 1 – Remove the nails



Step 2 – If available compressed air is the most simple solution for cleaning the magazine, be as thorough as possible

Step 3

– If no compressed air is available or if the magazine is really dirty degreaser is a good option for cleaning –
BUT MUST BE DRIED OFF BEFORE USE



Step 4 – Give it a thorough spray with the degreaser





Step 5 – dry off the degreaser, use compressed air (if available or a rag and air dry
